LIQUID GOLD STRUCK IN CHORE

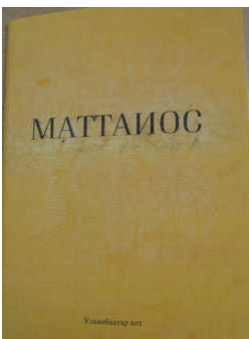
The water well has come in. Though it took 3 weeks to complete, our well in Chore is pumping water. Chore is at the beginning of the Gobi Desert and water is a very valuable. There are only a handful of wells in Chore and we are

very happy to be able to provide the church with running water. The other wells in Chore hit water at between 100-120 meters, we have water at 80 meters and our well is 104 meters deep. We thank the Lord for this great blessing. We will immediately put in a temporary shower and toilet. Our missionary family have lived all winter without water, electricity or indoor facilities. Construction of the permanent building will begin this month

The membership at Chengeltei increased by 30% this month. 5 new members were added by baptism which brings the membership to 21. Work will begin this month on clearing the property and start construction of their church building.

We had 150 books printed so all of our members would have the opportunity to give impute on the new translation. It took a year to complete the book of Matthew. upon, and the next books should come much easier and much quicker. The book of Mark has just been completed and should be ready to publish in April. It only took one month to complete this book. This has become the main focus of our NGO and we are totally committed to get a complete, trustworthy translation of the TR and KJV into the Mongolian peoples hands.

A RARITY IN MONGOLIA

It is amazing to listen to the testimonies of each of these men and what their life was before coming to know the Lord. Testimonies are a testament that our Lord can and will change a man's life.
